

# Centre of Excellence – Health Infrastructure (CEHI) Masters Scholarship in Health Project Management

<b>Purpose:</b>	To contribute to domestic compulsory tuition fees

## Description

---

The Scholarship was established in 2021 by the Centre of Excellence – Health Infrastructure (CEHI), A joint initiative between Auckland, Counties Manukau and Waitematā District Health Boards (DHB's). The Scholarship will support students in the CEHI internship programme and applicants are required to be enrolled part-time in the Master of Engineering Project Management – Health Projects specialisation programme at the University of Auckland during their internship with CEHI.

The Scholarship is to promote participation in the field of engineering, contribute to the development of health infrastructure, and advance the expertise and interest of New Zealand engineering graduates in the specialist health sector. The scholarship is open to all interns, but preference may be given to Māori and Pacifica students in alignment with the Northern District Health Board's equity policies.

## Selection process

---

Applications for this scholarship are made automatically when applying for the Master of Engineering Project Management – Health Projects specialisation programme at the University of Auckland and are then referred to CEHI.

The Scholarship is awarded by CEHI on the recommendation of the Governance Committee.

The recipients of the scholarships will be interns at either Auckland, Waitematā or Counties Manukau DHB capital works and facilities team.

## Regulations

---

1. The Scholarships will be known as the Centre of Excellence – Health Infrastructure (CEHI) Scholarship in Health Project Management.
2. The Scholarships will be awarded annually, for a period covering two years of part-time study. Each Scholarship will provide a total of \$8,000 paid over 4 instalments, one in each of the 4 study semesters, over the 2-year duration of the Master of Engineering Project Management – Health projects specialisation
3. The Scholarship may only be offered to a student who is enrolled part-time in the Master of Engineering Project Management - Health Projects specialisation and has been offered and accepted a paid internship by CEHI.
4. The Scholarship is applicable for students who are citizens or permanent residents of New Zealand or citizens of qualifying Pacific Island countries and who have been accepted as paid interns by CEHI (see Note II).
5. This scholarship is designed to promote participation in the health sector however preference may be given to Maori and Pasifika students in accordance with the Northern DHB's equity policies.

6. The basis of selection will include academic merit as assessed by the grade point average (GPA) or grade point equivalent (GPE) calculated over the most recent qualifying programme (see Note III), character, previous achievements as well as interest and ability in making a substantial contribution to developing health in NZ and/or the Pacific
7. CEHI may discontinue a scholarship if the student ceases to be an intern of CEHI.
  
8. The Scholarship will be awarded by CEHI, after referrals from the University of Auckland and upon the recommendation of the CEHI Governance Group
9. Payment will be made as lump sums, one in each semester as a contribution towards compulsory domestic fees. The first instalment will be paid in the third week of the first semester of enrolment (see Note I).
10. The CEHI Masters Scholarship in Health Project Management may be held with any other scholarship, award or grant where the Regulations for that scholarship, award or grant permit and where CEHI is informed and approves.
11. The student may not work in any other paid capacity during the tenure of this Scholarship and their paid internship with CEHI
12. CEHI has the power to terminate or suspend a Scholarship if it receives a report of unsatisfactory progress by the Associate Dean Postgraduate Taught of the Faculty of Engineering or if the student withdraws or is removed from the CEHI Internship programme.
13. CEHI has the power to amend or vary these regulations, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
14. CEHI is not obliged to make an award if there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
15. Notes [I] – [V] below are deemed to be regulations.

## Notes

---

- i. *Compulsory fees are only those related to the relevant programme of study, plus Student Services Fee up to the amount payable for domestic students enrolled in either a 120 or 180 point programme. International students who are awarded this Scholarship will be responsible for the balance between domestic and international fees and any International Student Insurance.*
- ii. *Qualifying Pacific Island countries include: Samoa, Tonga, Cook Islands, Niue, Tokelau, Fiji,*
- iii. *Detailed information on admissions and regulations for the Master of Engineering Project Management – Health Projects specialisation is available at the UoA regulations.*
- iv. *Recipients of CEHI Scholarship in Health Project Management will be required to give undertakings that they will comply with the regulations for the Scholarship and will notify CEHI of any change in their enrolment, employment or funding status. CEHI may, in the event it can be established that a recipient of an CEHI Scholarship in Health is not complying with these regulations, terminate the Scholarship and require repayment of the funds received from the date of the breach.*
- v. *Any publications resulting from work done during the tenure of the Scholarship shall include an acknowledgement of support provided by the Centre of Excellence - Health Infrastructure.*
- vi. *Scholarship funding will be specifically to contribute to domestic tuition fees and will be paid directly to the University of Auckland.*
